Welcome and Announcements:

Gordon Lansford, KCJIS Director called the meeting to order at 1:30pm.

Additions/Corrections to Minutes

September Minutes were reviewed but not approved because there was not a quorum.

Project/Activity Discussions

1) KCJIS 2012 Training Conference

- a) Handed out drafts of the proposed schedule with a choice of Option 1 (has a 9am break) or Option 2 (without 9am break). After a short discussion it was decided to go with Option 2. Discussion of classes presented in the past and which ones should be presented again this year. Amy had suggestions of new classes that could be presented and will make contact with some possible presenters for those classes. All members should provide Amy names of presenters for classes they suggested Still need to decide on a luncheon speaker.
- b) Next meeting we need to discuss how we will collect fees for the conference.
- c) Gordon is in charge of the vendors so any suggestions or contacts for vendor participation should go through him.

2) KBI Update

- a) CMS replacement project – KDOR has pushed their go-live date back to January 1, 2012 which gives us room to move our go-live date to December 4, 2011 allowing us a better chance of making the cutover successfully. We feel really good about this new date and all testing is nearly complete, development, test and certification servers have been created and stood up.
- b) KACIS (Kansas Administrative Customer Information System) is a new administration page for TAC's to administer their users. It is also an authorization engine that allows integration of new applications very easily and we are able to maintain a single sign on environment. Because of legacy interfaces we will maintain the previous CIS connection but all new interfaces will connect to KACIS.
- c) We are working on a "What's New" document describing the new features of the CMS will be coming out by November 14, 2011. We will also provide documentation to cover how to use KACIS to enter new users, modify a user, etc.
- d) KCJIS circuit upgrade issues have been resolved and that project should be getting ready to start back up again scheduling agencies for implementation.

- e) DMV project has been moved back to the earliest implementation date being after January 1, 2011.
 - f) We are working on building a Master Index search engine for the DUI interface to utilize and the project will not go live until March, 2012. Right now the only data that will be included in the Master Index is DUI but we want to include the other KCJIS interfaces to be able to utilize this functionality sometime in the future.
 - g) KIBRS automation project has moved to the RFI stage and hopefully at the end of this process we will have some direction as to where the project should be taken.
 - h) DUI tracking the vendor is working on requirements, high level design documentation and the feasibility study report. These should all be completed in January, 2012.
- 3) KDOR conversation about how information flows from the courts to law enforcement went very well. Trying to find a way for driver control to have the information in a timely manner without waiting for it to come from the courts after the fact.

4) Oracle Public Safety Update

- a) Overview of Oracle and the initiatives they are working on. Currently work with many Federal agencies along with Public Safety agencies across the United States and internationally.
- b) Oracle has solutions developed for PeopleSoft Enterprise Human Resources, billing and payroll, application development framework for creating web-based systems to link offices, inventory management with Oracle iProcurement, Oracle purchasing, Oracle management, Oracle database with real application clusters, Enterprise edition, user productivity kit for training employees, Oracle forms and reports, Oracle business intelligence, Oracle financials and Oracle application express.
- c) Oracle would like to partner and work with the State of Kansas sometime in the future.
